MONIES RAISED ARE USED TO PROVIDE AND MAINTAIN THESE FACILITIES.

Taree Showground is a designated "Glass Free" area and **NO** glass drink containers are to be brought onto the site.

The M.R.A. & H. Society Taree Inc. Committee reserves the right to search for any prohibited item including but not limited to weapons, controlled, dangerous or illegal substances, alcohol bottles and cans which may be expressly forbidden and subject to confiscation.

**NO** alcohol is to be consumed or carried in the Sideshow area.

No person under the legal drinking age is to attempt to purchase and / or consume any alcohol at the Showground. If of age, he or she will not consume such quantity of alcohol as would give rise to a blood reading above the legal limit allowable in the State for control of a motor vehicle, or such quantity which would adversely affect his/her ability to drive a motor vehicle, whichever is lesser.

Alcohol must **ONLY** be consumed in the designated licence area.

Drunken, unruly, offensive behaviour or fighting will result in removal from the Showground.

The M.R.A. & H. Society Taree Inc. Committee reserves the right to refuse admission without explanation and to eject any person whose conduct the

Committee or a member of the Committee deems disorderly, unruly, offensive or any person who is adversely affected by alcohol or otherwise behaves in a violent or threatening manner.

Any person supplying alcohol to a person under the legal drinking age will be ejected from the Showground.

Children under 10 years of age must be accompanied by an adult.

The speed limit for vehicles within the Showground area is 10 kilometres per hour.

Any person ejected from or directed to leave the Showground is therefore banned from re-entering the Showground until such time as the Committee of the M.R.A. & H. Society (Taree) Inc. has lifted the ban. Such person shall thereafter be treated as a trespasser and Police will be notified.

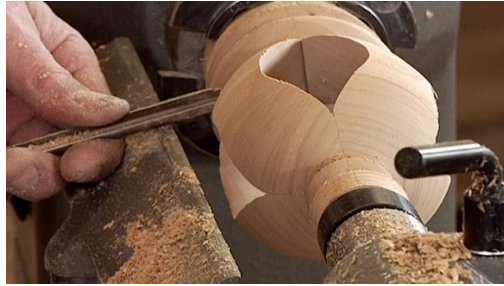
